Prior to his Omaha assignment, Col. Ubbelohde served as the Chief, Construction Programs Division for the Deputy Chief of Staff, Engineering, Headquarters, U.S. Army, Europe, in Heidelberg, Germany. He has held command and staff positions at Camp Humphries, Korea; Fort Ord, California; Fort Drum, New York; and Fort Belvoir, Virginia. He has also served as Staff Officer and Military Assistant to the Director, Defense Nuclear Agency, Alexandria, Virginia; and Chief, Nuclear Operations Branch, Joint Staff (J3), Pentagon.

Born in Anchorage, Alaska, Col. Ubbelohde is a graduate of the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, New York. He was commissioned in the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in 1979. He received a Master's degree in Physics from the University of California, San Diego, and a Master's degree in Strategic Studies from the U.S. Army War College, Carlisle.
